Revisiting Hormuz Jul 27 2022 The volume "Revisiting Hormuz", gathers the proceedings of a Conference organized in March 2007 by the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation, through its Centre Culturel Calouste Gulbenkian in Paris. The year 2007, exactly five centuries after the Portuguese first landed on the island of Hormuz, seemed to the scientific coordinators Rui Manuel Loureiro and Dejanirah Couto a very appropriate moment to bring together a large group of specialists that could establish the current state of the art in field of the history of Portuguese interactions with Hormuz and the Persian Gulf region. The chronological borders of the Conference, quite naturally, were extended to the early decades of the 17th century, to include the final departure of the Portuguese from Hormuz in 1622 and subsequent developments. Although the focus of the Paris Conference was supposed to be history, in any of its political, social, economic or cultural variants, the complex nature of Portuguese interactions with Hormuz and Safavid Persia, that spanned for more than a century, and also the existence of an important monumental heritage of Portuguese origin in the Gulf area, made the presence of art historians, architects, and archaeologists desirable.

Jan van Eyck and Portugal's 'Illustrious Generation' Apr 23 2022 This book investigates Jan Van Eyck's patronage by the Crown of Portugal and his role as diplomat–painter for the Duchy of Burgundy following his first voyage to Lisbon in 1428–1429, when he painted two portraits of Infanta Isabella, who became the third wife of Philip the Good in 1430. New portrait identifications are provided for the Ghent Altarpiece (1432) and its iconographical prototype, the lost Fountain of Life. These altarpieces are analysed with regard to King Joao I's conquest of Ceuta, achieved by his sons, who were hailed as an "illustrious generation." Strong family ties between the dynastic houses of Avis and Lancaster explain Lusitania's sustained fascination with Arthurian lore and the Grail quest. Several chapters of this book are overlaid with a chivalric veneer. A second "secret mission" to Portugal in 1437 by Jan van Eyck is postulated and this diplomatic visit is related to Prince Henry the Navigator's expedition to Tangier and King Duarte's attempts to forge an alliance with Alfonso V of Aragon. Late Eyckian commissions are reviewed in the light of this ill-fated crusade and additional new portraits are identified. The most significant artist of Renaissance Flanders appears to have been patronized as much by the House of Avis as by the Duchy of Burgundy. Barbara von Barghahn is Professor of Art History at George Washington University and a specialist in the art history of Portugal, Spain, and their colonial dominions, as well as Flanders. In 1993, she was conferred O Grao Comendador in the Portuguese Order of Prince Henry the Navigator. She has spent nearly a decade completing research about Jan van Eyck's diplomatic visits to the Iberian Peninsula.

Jan 21 2022 O quarto volume da série de monografias "Coleções Em Foco | Palácios Nacionais | Sintra Queluz Pena" é consagrado à atividade de D. Fernando II enquanto colecionador, tendo por base um inventário manuscrito pelo rei em 1866, documento doado ao Palácio Nacional da Pena. Dedicado aos núcleos de ourivesaria, marfins e esmaltes da coleção, o inventário constitui uma ferramenta essencial para dar a conhecer aquela faceta do monarca, uma vez que este alude, em discurso direto, aos objetos reunidos, descrevendo-os, classificando-os, revelando proveniências, propondo datações e fazendo por vezes apreciações técnicas e estéticas acerca dos mesmos. O interesse do inventário de 1866 levou à transcrição integral do mesmo, acompanhada por um estudo aprofundado onde, ao longo de dez capítulos, se exploram temas como a caracterização da coleção, a forma como se encontrava exposta, os agentes de mercado a quem o rei recorria ou a dispersão ocorrida após a sua morte. Foi ainda objetivo deste estudo identificar o maior número possível de peças mencionadas no inventário, há muito dispersas por diferentes coleções públicas e privadas, nacionais e estrangeiras ou em paradeiro incerto.

La collezione di argenti sacri della chiesa di Sant'Antonio dei Portoghesi in Roma
Feb 28 2020 Não sendo nosso objectivo, com este breve estudo, empreender uma análise exaustiva de todas as peças de prata de carácter sacro pertencentes à igreja de Santo António dos Portugueses em Roma, pretendemos porém efectuar uma primeira abordagem de tal acervo, de molde a trazê-lo ao conhecimento do público e despertar assim o eventual interesse de outros especialistas, bem como proporcionar uma primeira análise das peças mais relevantes, proporcionando também o acesso a um primeiro inventário. Começando por uma abordagem genérica do conjunto de prataria religiosa pertencente à igreja de Santo António dos Portugueses de Roma. De seguida concentrar-se-ão atenções nas peças consideradas excepcionais, às quais será concedida uma análise mais detalhada, para depois dar notícia das obras já existentes mas entretanto desaparecidas e das quais conseguimos apurar informação, com base na pesquisa arquivística empreendida, sobretudo no Arquivo do Instituto Português de Santo António e no Archivio di Stato di Roma Con il presente lavoro, che, per motivi di spazio, non potrà fornire un'analisi dettagliata dell'intera

argenteria sacra della chiesa di Sant'Antonio dei Portoghesi in Roma, mi propongo di avvicinare il pubblico a tale collezione, e di prenderne in esame gli esemplari più interessanti dal punto di vista artistico, con l'auspicio di destare l'interesse di altri specialisti del settore. Inizialmente, dunque, si propone uno sguardo sinottico sul corredo liturgico, con alcune brevi delucidazioni di ordine storicodescrittivo, per poi porre la lente d'ingrandimento sulle opere di maggior rilievo artistico: l'Urna della Reposizione e la muta di sei candelieri e croce d'altare. Ha anche compiuto studi specialistici in Museologia e Conservazione delle Opere d'Arte. Docente di Storia dell'Arte presso la Facoltà di Lettere dell'Università di Lisbona dal 2012. Consensus and Debate in Salazar's Portugal Dec 28 2019 Ellen Sapega's study documents artistic responses to images of the Portuguese nation promoted by Portugal's Office of State Propaganda under António de Oliveira Salazar. Combining archival research with current theories informing the areas of memory studies, visual culture, women's autobiography, and postcolonial studies, the author follows the trajectory of three well-known cultural figures working in Portugal and its colonies during the 1930s and 1940s. The book begins with an analysis of official Salazarist culture as manifested in two state-sponsored commemorative events: the 1938 contest to discover the "Most Portuguese Village in Portugal" and the 1940 Exposition of the Portuguese-Speaking World. While these events fulfilled their role as state propaganda, presenting a patriotic and unambiguous view of Portugal's past and present, other cultural projects of the day pointed to contradictions inherent in the nation's social fabric. In their responses to the challenging conditions faced by writers and artists during this period and the government's relentless promotion of an increasingly conservative and traditionalist image of Portugal, José de Almada Negreiros, Irene Lisboa, and Baltasar Lopes subtly proposed revisions and alternatives to official views of Portuguese experience. These authors questioned and rewrote the metaphors of collective Portuguese and Lusophone identity employed by the ideologues of Salazar's Estado Novo regime to ensure and administer the consent of the national populace. It is evident, today, that their efforts resulted in the creation of vital, enduring texts and cultural artifacts.
